

Homily for the Dedication Mass at St. Paul Catholic Church in Jacksonville Beach, Florida, by Bishop Felipe J. Estevez September 26, 2021, 2pm

In First Corinthians 3:9, St. Paul once said to the faithful at Corinth, "For we (the people of God) are God's co-workers, you are God's field, God's building. There is such excitement for this new Church, but as St. Paul says, "You are God's building, but far more important than the house of God is the family – a family in the process of becoming a true temple of his glory. Today is the blessing of this holy site. It is a joy to dedicate the beginning of this work of God and fruit of your generous stewardship for the last five years.

Despite the existing pandemic, I'm so thankful for the participation of so many of you, especially of your Pastor, Msgr. Michael Houle, who worked so hard for this day to happen and served you with such selfless dedication to bring this magnificent new church into being. Msgr. Houle, Fr. Kelly, and all of you can truly say with the psalmist "How lovely is your dwelling place, Oh Lord of hosts. Blessed are they who dwell in your house forever singing your praise."

What a magnificent place this building is – a permanent site in Jacksonville Beach for gathering a portion of the people of God to hear the Holy Scriptures from the Altar of the Word, to pray together, to take active participation in the Sacraments and above all, and most importantly, to celebrate the sacrifice of the Holy Mass! This beautiful Church must be a place which brings you always to Jesus Christ. It is a symbol of the heavenly realities of our true destiny – our eternal salvation.

This Church has a title: St. Paul Church. It was established 91 years ago by Bishop Barry. What a great centennial celebration will you all have here in 2030! This parish is also blessed with St. Peter Mission. You honor the great apostles of the Christian faith – Saints Peter and Paul! Being named after Paul, listening Sunday after Sunday to his letters, keeps you rooted in the origins of one of the Catholic Church's most important Apostles.

Everything that happens in St. Paul's parish is to lead you to Jesus Christ who is the way, the truth, the life. All the events taking place in this sacred building are to nurture and strengthen your relationship with the Lord Jesus. If asked by someone, "Who is Jesus?" you must know the answer. Like Peter, each of us can say: "Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of the Living God". Jesus is our Savior, our Redeemer, the eternally begotten of the Father, true God, of one being with the Father, through Him all things were made..."

In every person there is as St. Augustine said a "restlessness." God created us with a thirst, a hunger, a deep aspiration, a longing to be united with God. In the history of humanity, we are now in a period of a culture of secularity, which regretfully often pushes religion aside. Some people, in fact all of us, are concerned in the matters of this world, but as St. Augustine said so well, the human heart is restless until each person rests in God alone. As St. Irenaeus said, "The Glory of God is the human person fully alive," and a true fully alive person is one in full communion with God. To realize this is such a good awareness. To attain that happiness of walking with God, this Church building is needed. It enables all the people of God to praise and worship the holy name of Jesus Christ glorifying the Father in the Holy Spirit. The people of God attain its greater goal when on Sunday, the day of the Lord, the families of the neighborhood go to the liturgical assembly to praise, to honor, and to worship our living God. Our deepest, our truest happiness is to honor God - the source of all blessings. Here each one will be welcome in the House of God and refreshed by the living waters of the Heart of Jesus. Let us come often to this Church. Let our children, our elders, and the young adults meet our Savior. Let the entire neighborhood come and worship the living God.
